2015/2016 was an era of change and transition for the Jewish Federation of New Mexico. This year saw not only the release of the New Mexico Jewish Demographic Study results, which generated invaluable knowledge and visibility for our community, but also the implementation of unprecedented efforts to reach more Jewish New Mexicans than ever before. In less than a year, the Federation completed a comprehensive overhaul of its look and feel. These initiatives included a redesign of our Web presence and electronic resources, the revival of the printed *New Mexico Jewish Link*, growth of our contact database by approximately 50%, the launch of our membership program, and our re-introduction as

“the heart of Jewish New Mexico since 1948”. While we are building a foundation for growth, much work remains to fulfill our mission of serving and preserving Jewish life in New Mexico. We look forward to working with the community to sustain and nurture the spirit of tikkun olam and ensure that the Jewish community remains a light unto the land of enchantment now and into the future.

The Year in Review

Web Resources Renaissance

The Jewish Federation of New Mexico successfully completed a comprehensive upgrade of its online presence. The brand-new website at www.jewishnewmexico.org is accessible, user friendly, and full of information for Jewish New Mexicans. The site includes our new New Mexico Jewish Resource Center, which provides contact and access information for Jewish organizations and institutions throughout the state. We are also pleased to work with ABQ Jew to host the Jewish Community Calendar, which lists Jewish events and programs across New Mexico. The electronic version of the New Mexico Jewish Link, accessible at www.newmexicojewishelink.com or via the federation website, has also moved to a striking new format.

Federation Membership: a New Way to Invest in New Mexico's Jewish Community

The Jewish Federation of New Mexico launched its new membership and donor relations program this year, enabling the organization to provide individual community members with a sense of ownership and buy-in to the activities of the Federation. Membership levels and benefits vary depending on the amount of an individual's contribution to the Federation's annual campaign, which this year was rebranded as the "2016 Heart of Jewish New Mexico Campaign". The \$36 basic annual membership includes a subscription to the quarterly print edition of the *New Mexico Jewish Link*, along with discounted admission to paid Federation events. Other donor levels include Friend of the Federation (\$180), Mitzvah Circle (\$360), Sinai Circle (\$1,000), Jerusalem Society (\$5,000), and JFNM Chai Desert Society (\$10,000).

The *New Mexico Jewish Link* is Back

By popular demand, the Jewish Federation of New Mexico has revived the *New Mexico Jewish Link* as a quarterly print publication. Now in full color, the *Link* reaches approximately 5,000 Jewish households across New Mexico. The Federation is committed providing high-quality locally-generated content concerning Jewish life in New Mexico, Israel, and other areas of interest to our state's Jewish community. The *Link* is sustained by philanthropic contributions and advertising sales, both of which will be necessary to continue providing this important service to the community.

Seders of the Southwest

The Jewish Federation of New Mexico hosted its first-ever "Seders of the Southwest" at the Hilton Buffalo Thunder Resort near Santa Fe. The turnout for the first- and second-night Sedarim vastly exceeded expectations, reaching the room's capacity of 70 attendees each night. Most importantly, the

majority of participants were new to Federation and organized Jewish life, coming together from communities throughout northern New Mexico to begin a new Pesach tradition.

Statewide Outreach

The Jewish Federation of New Mexico continued to make progress toward fulfilling a statewide mission. Notably, the federation is now the official New Mexico agent for Rabbis Without Borders (RWB), a nationwide program committed to providing rabbinic services to rural and underserved Jewish communities. Through RWB and the Federation's own Shufatim ("Partners") program, the Jewish Federation of New Mexico is able to send clergy and knowledgeable lay people to conduct services and help support rural communities, including those in Roswell, Carlsbad, and Las Vegas.

Israel Advocacy

No organization does more in New Mexico to fight delegitimization efforts against Israel and the Jewish people. Our leaders educate the media, interfaith clergy, and community members on the destructive goals of the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) movement. This year, the Federation has partnered with the Anti-Defamation League, the newly-established Santa Fe Middle East Watch, and other organizations to bring accurate perspectives on Israel, Judaism, and the Middle East to the broader community. Federation professionals and volunteers have also spoken on behalf of the New Mexico-Israel relationship before the Albuquerque City Council, Bernalillo County Commission, Santa Fe civic leadership, and faith leaders from across the state. The Federation works regularly with Israel advocacy organizations both locally and nationally to ensure that New Mexico is represented in the collective effort supporting a secure Jewish state and a strong U.S.-Israel relationship.

Jewish New Mexico: from Generation to Generation

Administered and funded by the Jewish Federation of New Mexico, Hillel at the University of New Mexico has been at the forefront of efforts to perform Israel advocacy and provide welcoming, robust Jewish life on campus. The Aaron David Bram Hillel House, under the guidance of Dr. Sara Koplik, provides a welcoming, enriching environment for our young people to embrace their heritage.

PJ Library in New Mexico is also supported by the Federation, bringing a monthly gift of Jewish books to Jewish children throughout the state. In 2015/2016, the Jewish Federation of New Mexico became part of the PJ Our Way program, expanding PJ Library's reach in New Mexico to children up to age 11. As a result, the number of young children enrolled in the program increased this year from 300 to over 400.

Partnering with Israel

The partnership between the Jewish Federation of New Mexico and the Ramat Ha-Negev Regional Council continues to flourish. Ramat HaNegev is a vast desert area south of Beersheva that extends along the border with Egypt and shares much in common with New Mexico. In February, the Federation hosted a delegation from Ramat HaNegev consisting of Mayor Shmulik Rifman, City CEO Eran Doron, and Communication Director Adva Lloyd. The delegation spent two full days in New Mexico, meeting with elected and Jewish leaders in both Albuquerque and Santa Fe. They also made important connections with water resource management professionals, technology sector leaders at the Santa Fe Business Incubator, and with the Albuquerque and Bernalillo County economic development offices. The delegation also met with Santa Fe Mayor Javier Gonzales, Albuquerque Mayor Richard Berry, and toured

an organic farming complex south of Albuquerque. For the second straight year, the Federation made an allocation to help fund a maternal and infant health clinic, and Ramat HaNegev pledged to send shlichim to help educate Jewish youth and young adults.
